It has been an exciting time for our ministry as we've been working on remodeling our church. Time has gone so fast and the Lord has been good to us allowing us to see a major change in our church building. The biggest blessing has been that although we had to cancel services a couple of Sundays, stream an online message and most of the time we gathered in a cramped multi purpose house, we have received new visitors and decisions were made during that time. The Lord IS GOOD. This project had a few hiccups. One night a man broke into the building, the police were called and the man was aprehended. We ended up at the police station until 3:00AM. He climbed up from the outside but in an empty building with tall walls, he couldn't get out of the building. Nothing was lost or destroyed. It was a sad situation because our church has helped this man over time. He lives on the street and is addicted to drugs. The very next morning he was walking by the church and when Esteban saw him he apologized stating that he had made a mistake. We had witnessed to him before this incident.

Then we suffered weather conditions, rain stopped the building process a couple of times but finally on September 7th we had our first service. We had no electricity and it was 42 degrees but we had the best time together, happy to see a brand new building but most of all happy to be together as one body. I always reflect on where we were 7 years ago and where we are now. The people that have come to know their Savior, how our teachers used to teach our kids on rainy days under a porch and now the spaces we have. I reflect on the many lives that have been changed. How many ladies Emily have been discipling, especially Blanca, a single mother with no education, that could barely survive financially and started to grow in the Lord and her life has been changed. How much she loves our church and volunteers to clean this church very often. I reflect on Mayra, who lived in a swamp with her 7 kids and how her big smile was so contagious the day we came together to paint the walls and over and over she said "I am doing this for God" as she will look up to the sky. I reflect on how Raphael, who lost his son Mateo due to cancer, remains faithful and is so happy about this church building. He donated the entire flooring for it. I think of how last Sunday a lady came and cried from the first song on because she has been away from God for several years, she was hurt at church and there she was with a stirred heart listening to

A LOST CULTURE THAT NEEDS GOD

Since the new president took over, 7 months ago here in Uruguay, we've seen unprecedented events. Last month an *Umbanda* religion priest performed a ritual at the presidential office. Umbanda blends African traditions, Indigenous Brazilian elements, Spiritism, and Roman Catholicism, centered around the belief in intermediary spirits that possess mediums during ceremonies to offer guidance, healing, and wisdom to practitioners. This month, being "pride month", the president allowed a trans man to perform a very sensual dance that was aired on public television. The presidential office was filled with drag queens and advocators for the LGBT+ movement.

Uruguay desperately needs the Gospel. The great question is Who is going to respond to the call of God to the Uruguayan people and say "here Lord, Send me?"

Pray for our strength, our wisdom, our testimony as we labor to see more people surrendering to the Lord.
